INACTIVE STATUS BY REASON OF OUTSTANDING WARRANT
OF ARREST OR OUTSTANDING "BENCH WARRANT"
OR OUTSTANDING "BODY ATTACHMENT"

- 1. Transfer of Cases - Any Circuit Judge or Associate Judge may, by
 Order entered in the case on the Court's own motion, transfer to Inactive
 Status any pending case in which a warrant or other writ for arrest of
 the defendant has been outstanding and unserved for a period of two (2)
 years. Cases so transferred to Inactive Status pursuant to this Order
 shall not be considered as pending cases for statistical purposes.
- 2. Reinstatement to Active Pending Status - Upon the arrest of any defendant in a cause previously so transferred to Inactive Status, any Circuit Judge or Associate Judge concerned shall, by Order in the case, transfer said cause to Active Pending Status to be disposed of accordingly, and considered as a pending case for statistical purposes.
- 3. Call of Inactive Status Cases - Annually in the month of May the Circuit Clerk shall prepare a list of all cases so transferred to Inactive Status that have been pending on Inactive Status for over 12 months.

 A copy of the list shall be delivered by the Clerk to the Office of the State's Attorney of the County and to the Presiding Judge.

 The presiding Judge shall annually in the month of June order a

call of the cases so pending.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER (Continued)

On the annual call of such cases, determination shall be made whether the case should remain on Inactive Status, be dismissed, or reinstated as an active case.
